Mary Beth Flynn Makic, PhD, RN, CCNS, FAAN, FNAP, FCNS, is a professor at University of Colorado College of Nursing and a research scientist at Denver Health. A clinician for more than 36 years, she is well

recognized as a leader in critical care. Makic's research focuses on creation of interprofessional initiatives to advance the translation and sustained adoption of science into practice. She's well known for her work to advance independent nursing practice based on current best evidence to promote clinical innovations that enhance patient outcomes. She has authored over 110 journal publications and 70 book chapters, and is the editor of several acclaimed textbooks. She frequently presents on strategies for overcoming barriers to evidence-based adoption, integration and sustainment in organizations. Among her many honors are fellowships in the American Academy of Nursing, National Academies of Practice and Clinical Nurse Specialist Institute, and she is currently serving a three-year term as a member of the AHRQ National Advisory Council. Makic earned a PhD at University of Colorado Health Sciences Center, a Master of Science at University of Maryland School of Nursing, and a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from University of Wisconsin, Madison.
